

## **Outpatient Prescribing** – A Quick Guide



Immediate prescription required within the next 14 days?

- ➤ PRESCRIBE the drug
- > DO NOT request the GP prescribes

New medication being initiated in Secondary Care?

- ➤ The clinician who wishes to initiate medication for the patient should undertake appropriate pre-treatment assessment and counselling
- ➤ They are responsible for communicating the rationale for treatment, including benefits, risks & alternatives, arranging any follow-up requirements that might be necessary, and documenting all of this in any related correspondence

Ongoing prescribing from GP required?

- Please check the locally agreed Prescribing Formulary to ensure that the intended prescription is appropriate to prescribe, and potentially appropriate for continuation in Primary Care (RAG status)
- ➤ This is particularly important for any AMBER medications and those that require monitoring, for medications that are being used off-license and for any newer medications that may be unfamiliar to other clinicians.
