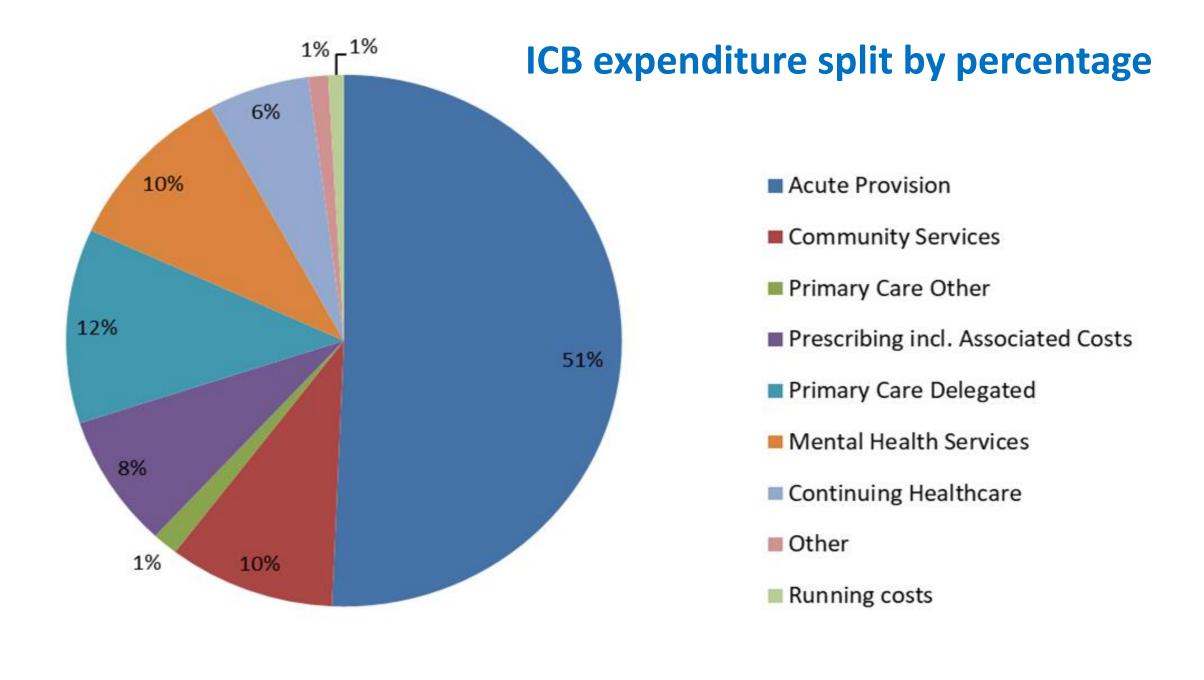

Capital investments 2023-24



- £14m modernisation Mossley Hill Hospital MH, with facility to be completed in 2025/26
- Further investment in Warrington (£6m), East Cheshire (£4m), and Mersey and West Lancs (£4m) community diagnostic centres
- £10m on new Arrowe Park Hospital A&E
- Further elective recovery investment at Mid Cheshire (£8m), Alder Hey (£4m), East Cheshire (£4m) and Warrington (£4m).
- Frontline Digitisation and Electronic Patient Records Liverpool (£2m),
 Mid and East Cheshire (£12m), Warrington (£2m), Mersey and West Lancs (£4m)
- Women and Children's new build at Countess of Chester (£30m)
- New Hospital Programme Mid Cheshire mobilisation (£10m)
